Use a paper, plastic or biodegradable bag for biowaste.



- Furniture e.g. sofas
- Constructional waste
- · Porcelain items e.g. toilet seats and sinks



ELECTRICAL WASTE

All devices that use electricity such as:



- Refrigerators and freezers
- ITC-devices



HAZARDOUS WASTE

Wastes that cause harm to people or the environment:


- All batteries
- Oils, paints, varnishes, glues and solvents
- · Washing agents with hazard symbols

Products whose main material is plastic, such as:



- Barrels and canisters
- Garden chairs and tables



END-OF-LIFE TEXTILES

Dry, clean and unusable clothes and household textiles such as:

- · Coats, trousers, shirts and skirts
- Sheets, towels and tablecloths



TREATED WOOD

All painted, varnished, or treated wood, such as:



- · Painted and varnished wood
- Shelves and wooden furniture
- · Chipboard, plywood, parquet, and laminate




- Pallets and cable drums

GARDEN WASTE


Leaves, rakings, plants and plant parts such as:


